PUBLIC POLICY COUNCIL PRIORITIES

- **Transportation:** Support improvements to Missouri's transportation infrastructure that enhances the growth and development of Jackson County **(supported by MO Chamber and MO Federation)**
 - Regional transportation plan for eastern Jackson county (county, KCATA, MARC)
 - Supports a local/regional plan to include gas tax, tolls, sales tax, etc.
- **Economic Development:** Support initiatives that will enhance quality business development in Missouri by attracting new and retaining existing employers
 - Improve workforce training funding, effectiveness and certified work ready talent
 - Enhance and simplify local tax abatement process
 - Reinvestment of tax credits and reform
 - Support policy to expand access to broadband, including the final mile buildout, to help Missouri meet 21st Century business needs. **(supported by MO Chamber and MO Federation)**
 - Implement Internet sales tax reform to level the playing field between online and main street retailers **(supported by MO Chamber and MO Federation)**
- **Education:** Support funding for Missouri's educational system (Pre K-12 and higher education) that will prepare students to become suitably competent and workforce ready
 - A long-term plan to fully fund and maintain the integrity of the Foundation Formula.
 - Support investments in high-quality early education programs as well as internship programs within the school districts
 - Fully support funding the A+ scholarship program
 - Advocate for the systematic education reforms driven by employers' workforce needs **(supported by MO Chamber and MO Federation)**
 - Maintaining competitive investment in public higher education to preserve affordability and produce a well-trained workforce
- **Healthcare:** Advocate for an improved healthcare system through the implementation of proactive approaches to decrease the number of uninsured and improve access to healthcare
 - Enact a statewide prescription drug monitoring program that lowers workforce drug abuse and insurance costs for Missouri employers **(supported by MO Chamber and MO Federation)**
 - Support Legislation that provides the appropriate level of funding to ensure the ongoing viability of all health care providers who furnish care to the uninsured and underinsured
