The City of Raytown is in the process of designing new streetscape enhancements for the Downtown area, which represents a significant opportunity for the City to revitalize the physical appearance within the heart of the community. While the existing streets in Downtown Raytown have faithfully served the needs of motorists over the years, they have not lived up to their full potential to also serve the needs of pedestrians, bicyclists, transit, and adjacent commercial activity in a balanced manner.

Through a balanced and pragmatic approach to transforming the physical and aesthetic character of these streets, a true and authentic "sense of place" can be established – one that both complements the City's unique history and speaks to its future as a vibrant community destination. The streetscape design effort is anticipated to support a holistic and long-term vision for what this area can become.

Funded through a Federal Transportation Enhancement Grant and matching City funds, Phase One of the project will include revitalizing 63rd Street between Raytown Road and Blue Ridge Boulevard to include wider sidewalks, increased on -street parking, and the addition of new traffic signals, street trees, and other amenities intended to beautify the area. This one-block section will set the tone for future phases of implementation, allowing the Downtown area to be improved incrementally over time while utilizing consistent streetscape design standards to visually unify the Downtown district. The streetscape design is intended to complement and reinforce the visual character of the City's civic gateway improvements, located at several locations throughout Raytown including the 63rd Street and Blue Ridge Cutoff intersection, Gregory Boulevard and Raytown Road, etc.

The City's selected consultant team is led by Confluence, a landscape architecture and planning firm located in Kansas City. Confluence has been instrumental in revitalizing other streetscapes and downtown districts throughout

the Kansas City metropolitan area, and has been working with a City-appointed Steering Committee that includes a broad cross-section of Downtown business and property owners and members of the community. Plans for Phase I of the downtown streetscape are anticipated to be ready for bidding in mid-2012, with Phase I construction anticipated to begin in the fall of this year.

Once completed, this streetscape project has the potential to spark a resurgence in further improving the Downtown area. Wider sidewalks and the availability of adjacent on-street parking will provide a significant boost to local commercial businesses, and will likely appeal to other retail and restaurant operations that may not have previously considered the Raytown's Downtown area. As other local streetscape revitalization projects have experienced, additional private-sector development and revitalization efforts have been stimulated by investing in and improving the quality and character of the streetscape. This project represents another step forward in the evolution of Downtown Raytown revitalization.



Other Comments:

The Raytown Water Company (RWC) was found by Dr. Samuel JT Davis in 1925, prior to Raytown becoming a City and is presently under the direction of Neal S. Clevenger, President and General Manager, 3rd Generation.

RWC is the 2nd largest private water utility in the State of Missouri next to American Water. As a Private Utility, we are regulated by the State of Missouri Public Service Commission who set our rates and procedures, Mo Dept. of Natural Resources and US Dept. of Environmental Protection Agency.

RWC currently has 3 active water towers with a storage capacity of 2.5 M gallons of water to serve 6500 connections. We currently purchase all water from Kansas City on an average of 1.25M gallons per day and maintain approximately 364,115 Ft of mains and 518 fire hydrants. We conduct weekly water quality testing and send them to MODNR in lefferson City. An annual water quality report is released in July and sent to every customer in our system.

Raytown is unique as the Sewer Dept. is a separate entity thru the City. We are contracted by the City of Raytown to assist with their collection efforts on sewer accounts by state statue however do not have access to their customer information. Customers needing information regarding sewer billing would need to contact City Hall and not RWC.
