#### **MARCH MEMBERSHIP LUNCHEON**

MoDOT staff will be presenting on a 350 Highway Study currently in progress. The project builds upon earlier studies and looks at the economic impacts of converting a four lane divided highway (Sterling to Maple-separate EB and WB roadbeds with independent alignments) to a combined six lane divided median facility. Included with the roadway improvements is the study of re-assembling of parcels into developable frontage, review of current access and proposed access management improvements, and a return on investment study to determine if the expense of improving 350 Highway will increase economic development within the corridor.

#### Got Drugs? Turn in your unused or expired medication for safe disposal on April 27

Raytown has instituted a local "Drug take back program". The purpose of such a program is to allow for safe, legal and environmentally friendly disposal of extra drugs that patients have not used.

#### The program serves two purposes:

**First, it reduces the risk of prescription drugs entering the water**, potentially harming aquatic life or getting into the human water supply. In the past, people were advised to flush unused drugs down the toilet – but that option can lead to questionable contaminants ultimately going into the water supply.



Second and perhaps more importantly, take back programs reduce the risk of prescription drugs being consumed inappropriately – either by accident or through illegal sale. Wide spread evidence indicates that a huge portion of illegal prescription drug use occurs when people raid friends' and relatives' medicine cabinets.

Public Water Supply Dist. #2 has provided the Raytown Police Dept. with a prescription drug take back box, located in the lobby of the Police Department. It is for the disposal of over the counter or prescription drugs. No questions asked.

Drug take back event on April 27, from 10 am – 2 pm at the Apple Market on 75<sup>th</sup> & Raytown Road or at the City Hall Parking lot at 10000 E 59<sup>th</sup> Street.

#### Our Members in the News

On Tuesday, February 12, Integrity Roofing surprised Executive Director of Hope Network, Janet Lowe with the \$1,000 check. Each year, Hope Network provides qualifying families and individuals, with practical services to help meet their needs and most importantly to give them hope. Located in Raytown, Missouri, the Hope Network was

uniquely created to assist this community. Families who are in need of transportation can qualify for a donated car, or help with car repairs. Elementary children receive prescription glasses to ensure their school year is a success. And the most basic of all needs – **food is provided by the thousands of pounds yearly to families, individuals, and seniors.** Even children's backpacks are filled with food before the weekend to ensure they will not go hungry or miss a meal when school is out! Currently, the Hope Network's health clinic is at full capacity - treating 56 patients each week. Their dental program is also seeing large numbers of people who are experiencing health concerns as a direct result of their dental related issues.



The need is great," Janet said, "This community needs people that advocate by telling people about Hope Network. Even if we don't have money, we have voices. Everyone has a level where they can help. You can push a cart, donate a coat, we all have something we can give."

This year **Southeast Enterprises** partnered with the City of Raytown, Raytown School District, and Raytown Wal-Mart, Fox 4, Deffenbaugh, City Scrap Metal, Arvest Bank, Mid-Continent Public Libraries, Bancability locations, along with several other partners in our Annual Holiday Light Recycling Drive. Our goal for the 2012-2013 Holiday Light Recycling Drive was to keep 24,000 pounds of lights out of the landfill while providing meaningful work for over 160 employees with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

The drive ended on January 13, 2013 and we ended up collecting **over 31,000 pounds of lights!** We thank everyone in Kansas City for their help in exceeding our goal. This has been a great endeavor and has kept our employees hard at work preparing the lights for recycling. We are already planning next year's 2013-2014 Holiday Light Recycling Drive. We have received a grant from MARC Solid Waste District Management to help cover the cost for the pickup and delivery of these lights for next year's drive.
