

# RideKC << TAXI

Anywhere you want. Anytime you want. Weekends? Holidays? Late at night? It doesn't matter.

Seniors and riders with disabilities in parts of the metro area will have more freedom to get around with a new pilot taxi voucher program that started July 5. The Kansas City Area Transportation Authority is piloting a regional taxi voucher program similar to ones operated in Olathe, Lenexa and Shawnee, Kansas. The program is open to anyone 65 and older as well as anyone with a disability in parts of eastern Jackson County in Missouri, including Independence, Raytown and Sugar Creek.

Using 10/10 Taxi, eligible riders can go anywhere they want in the region up to 10 miles for \$5 each way. Riders have to pay the regular cost of the fare after the first 10 miles. The service is available any day at any time, including weekends and holidays. Ten one-way trips are allowed each month.

"This is all about access, but at the same time it's a way of thinking outside the box and looking for new and innovative ways to offer public transportation to our constituents," said Steve Klika, chairman of the KCATA Board of Commissioners. "We want to give our residents more flexibility to get around while measuring whether there is a more cost-effective way to provide public transportation."

Anyone interested should go to the <u>RideKC Taxi page</u>. An application also can be obtained by calling 816-221-0660. A 2x2 inch photo (selfies are allowed) is required for an identification card that will be mailed to eligible riders. Participants can have a photo taken at either location, but must call the Regional Call Center at 816-221-0660 to make an appointment.

The card will work like a debit card. When you receive it in the mail – between seven to 10 business days after the application is approved – instructions will be provided showing you how to upload value onto your new card so it can be swiped when using the cab.

The Raytown School District is pleased to announce its Alumni Hall of Fame Class for 2016. The class includes six individuals who will join the ranks of other respected alumni on during the October 7 and 8 Induction Weekend activities.

Dr. Cynthia (Paris) Burkhead is a 1975 graduate of Raytown High School. Dr. Burkhead is the English Department Chair at University of Northern Alabama and is a nationally recognized lecturer, presenter, and author.

Mark Corey is a 1986 graduate of Raytown High School. Corey is a multi-award winning journalist, producer, reporter, and photographer for the CBS affiliate KRQE in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Dr. Mark Hoffman is a 1987 graduate of Raytown South High School. Dr. Hoffman is the Numni Hall of Fame Director of Health Insights at UMKC and the Director of the Translational Bioinformatics for Children's Mercy Hospital.

Jim Martin is a 1971 graduate of Raytown High School. He is a decorated retired Navy Commander and combat veteran, who served as a U.S. Navy Aerospace Engineering Officer and National Improvised Explosive Device counter-terrorism expert.

Mike Swanson is a 1972 graduate of Raytown High School. Swanson is the Vice President of Communications and Broadcasting for the Kansas City Royals.

Dr. Starnes Walker attended Raytown Schools from Kindergarten through his 11th grade year in 1964. Dr. Walker is a Professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering and the Founding Director of the University of Delaware Cybersecurity Initiative (UDCSI).

The six inductees will meet with students at the two district high schools, will be featured speakers at a community luncheon, and will be introduced at the Raytown High School football game all on Friday, October 7 at Chittwood Stadium; the formal induction ceremony takes place on Saturday, October 8. This is the 12th class to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, which began in 2005.

#### RAYTOWN'S STUDENT-LED SPACE PROGRAM STARTS COUNTDOWN TO LAUNCH —RQS Unveils New Satellite Project

Raytown Quality Schools (RQS) today revealed a new, "out of this world" student-driven space program, Raytown Mission to Space: IGNITE Satellite Program. Over the next 9 months, Raytown students will work with Interorbital Systems to build, test and launch a low-orbit satellite into space—becoming one of only a handful of K-12 districts in the entire country to send a payload into orbit.

"This is a 21st century endeavor that will give Raytown students hands-on experience and skills," Superintendent Dr. Allan Markley said. "The program is an effort few school districts and communities have pursued, and our students are energized to make it happen. We are excited for our students to begin the mission at the start of the new school year, with our sights set on lift off in 2017."

Throughout the yearlong endeavor, students will develop skills relating to project management, engineering, programming, HAM radio operation, photography, and marketing. Students will chronicle their efforts and progress via blog posts and on social media. The public can follow along on Facebook and Twitter at #Raytown2Space.

The satellite is scheduled for launch in May 2017 off the coast of California on Interorbital's Neptune Rocket. When in orbit, the satellite will collect information and data to enhance Raytown's K-12 STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) curriculum.
