### **CONGRATULATIONS ON THE 50th ANNIVERSARY!**

On March 23, 1966, the Raytown Historical Society was chartered under the sponsorship of the Raytown Chamber of Commerce with about 50 charter members. Fifty years later, the society has five of the charter members in the Raytown area. They are: Lloyd Campbell, Roberta Bonnewitz, Harold Hatch, Evelyn Crews, and Bette Mathison.



Activities during these early years included public bus tours of historical sites in Raytown including the Rice-Tremonti home and slave cabin, Cave Springs, Campground Cemetery, and Byrams' Ford. The Society's first of many markers was for the William Ray blacksmith shop and placed at the present day Raytown Road and 63rd Street. The Society held many fundraisers to maintain the organization and the idea of finding a permanent place for exhibits and records. In 1981, the Historical Society purchased Raytown Fire Station No. 1, built in 1944. Construction of the Museum was finished in 1982 and exhibit areas were added in the next several years. Members then built an addition to the Museum in 1991.

This museum began with people seeing the importance of saving our local history, and it has thrived for the last 50 years with the help of the many dedicated volunteers and generous donors having the same desire for history preservation. School children come to see the old-time schoolroom, blacksmith shop and other exhibits. Older visitors come and say "remember when..." Come visit our museum, there is something for everyone to enjoy. There are many interesting displays, rotating exhibits, research materials, Raytown school photos and yearbooks from 1909 onward, monthly Ambassadors programs on many topics, and much more! 


