On March 9, 2017 the Raytown Area Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors voted to oppose HB634.

The Board of Directors publicly opposes HB634 because expanding charter schools could cause undue burden on the residents and business owners within the boundaries of the Raytown School District thereby negatively impacting the economic growth of our vibrant community.

Public education improves the quality of our workforce, promotes economic development, safety and security, and HB634 could impact and decrease the educational structure of our community.



RAYTOWN QUALITY SCHOOLS NEWS

The Raytown School District received the honorable mention award in the 5,000-20,000 enrollment category in the 23rd Magna Awards program sponsored by the National School Boards Association's magazine, American School Board Journal, & supported by Sodexo, a leader in delivering sustainable, integrated facilities management & food service operations. The District was one of only 33 districts selected from 200 submissions nationwide. The District's submission details the successes of the Raytown Schools Wellness Center including a 79% reduction in a worker compensation expenses resulting in a reduction in worker compensation insurance premium of over \$300,000.

The Magna Awards is a national recognition program that honors school board best practices & innovative programs that advance student learning & recognizes school districts and their leaders for taking bold & innovative steps to improve the lives of students & their communities. For more than 20 years, the Magna Awards panel of independent judges has reviewed programs that showcase school district leadership, creativity, & commitment to student achievement. The District is recognized in a special section published in print & online in American School Board Journal, as well as at the School Leaders Luncheon at NSBA's Annual Conference on March 25, in Denver, Colorado.

MID-CONTINENT PUBLIC LIBRARY SEEKS COMMUNITY INPUT ON PROPOSED BRANCH ENHANCEMENTS

Beginning on March 2, Mid-Continent Public Library will launch a series of public meetings across its three-county district for community members to gather & learn more about the Library's plans for the future, as well as express their thoughts on what each branch can do to better serve local residents.

The meetings, led by members of MCPL's administrative leadership, were scheduled after the November general election in which voters approved Proposition L, a proposed increase to the Library's levy for the purposes of building & renovating branches & maintaining or expanding collections, services, & programs. The meetings will offer attendees the opportunity to join in a dialogue about how services should be customized to their community, including the expansion of branch hours or modification of programming & resources.

"Community dialogue & feedback are vital parts of our operations at Mid-Continent Public Library," said Steven Potter, Library Director & CEO. "We try very hard to provide the best library experience to our residents, & the way we accomplish that is through open dialogue & public input on what residents want to see from their Library. We're very grateful to the voters for their approval of Prop L, & because of their support, we're now able to open this exciting new chapter of growth & improvement in the Library's history."

Prop L passed with a total of 62.3% approval & support from the majority of voters in all three counties in the Library's district (Jackson, Clay, & Platte). Although the Library will not begin collecting the approved levy amount until the end of 2017 (based on the standard property tax cycle), MCPL leadership will use feedback from the meetings to guide the planning & budgeting process preceding the launch of its next fiscal year (July 2017).

The Raytown High School Jay Crew will again sponsor a "Hunger Games Food Drive" benefiting the Raytown Emergency Assistance Program (REAP). Each school building in the Raytown School District will collect non-perishable food items and monetary donations through March 31. On Saturday, April 1, Jay Crew and other student groups from around the District will be at the following locations: Hy-Vee located on 350 Highway, Wal-mart located on 350 Highway, Apple Market located at 63rd and Woodson, and Raytown High School from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. collecting food items and monetary donations. Last year, students collected more than 6,000 items and raised \$1,100 for REAP. Students earned a \$10,000 charity grant and \$5,000 in technology products for the school by finishing in the top ten of 2400 schools participating in a Lead2Feed Student Leadership project.
