# RAYTOWN QUALITY SCHOOLS NEWS



Meet & Greet RHS New Football Coach - February I - 7-8pm - Raytown High School Library Come meet the new Raytown High School Football Coach-Logan Minnick-coming to us from Kearney.

Southland CAPS will be holding an Information Meeting on **Monday, February 13th at 6:30 pm** at Herndon Career Center. We will provide information about Southland CAPS, as well as, answer any questions people might have. We invite community members, parents and students who would be interested in more information about the program.





Part of a five-year plan to offer no cost, half-day pre-kindergarten services to all four-year-olds in Raytown, the Raytown C-2 School District is ex-panding its early childhood offerings beginning with the 2017-2018 school year. The District will offer 170 new pre-k seats in addition to the 68 Head Start and 17 fee-based seats currently offered at Herndon Preschool. The District will also continue to offer Title I and Special Education services at New Trails Early Learning Center. In addition to the new seats, the District will also provide transportation for all of its early childhood programs.

"The data shows that the longer our students stay with us, the better they perform both behaviorally and academically," Superintendent Dr. Allan Markley said. "We now have the opportunity to start building a strong foundation at an earlier age. I am thankful for the community's support, which gave us the courage to move forward with our plan."

"By the start of the next school year, our early childhood program will offer over 500 preschool seats. Though some of our programs cater to students age 3-5, next year's expansion will cover a significant part of our goal to offer early childhood services to every four-year-old in our attendance area, which we estimate to be around 630 prospective students in a given year," Dr. Markley said.

Pre-registration is open from February 3 - 17. Children must be four years old on or before July 31, 2017 to be eligible for one of the 170 pre-k seats. Families with students who are currently enrolled in Herndon Preschool or New Trails Early Learning Center, who will be returning for the 2017-2018 school year, do not need to pre-register for placement.




