(BF) Board attended a work session on Thursday, March 28, 2019 to go over some initial drawings for the outside improvements as well as the inside. Lots of great discussion about the drawings and what the overall feel of the building will convey to those who visit the Chamber office or bike/run/walk by while on the Rock Island Trail.



We are getting close to putting the finishing touches on the Capital Campaign with regards to raising fund to help offset some of the costs associated with the remodel.

The building was 30 years old in November of 2018 and is in desperate need of some updating along with providing a true handicapped entrance on the south side of the building. The Board has felt this was the perfect time for the remodel with the Trail coming through and improvements being done to the property by Jackson County. The BF is a 501 c 3 so all donations both cash, product or service may be tax deductible and some type of plaque will be displayed once the remodel is finished. Be watching for more information to come out but if you know you are interested contact me today! We will be needing everything from cement to toilets, to doors and door handles, paint and carpet

I am working on several grant applications to help offset some of the amenities associated with the trail. These are community grants with an emphasis on transportation both walkability and bicycling and a way to enhance tourism in Raytown.

I know these photos are not very clear but they show the signage, ground breaking and a couple early construction photos from 1988. We are so excited about what the future has in store for the property and hope you are too.



By adding "and tourism" to our name, we hope to capitalize on our position on the trail to be a center of information for any visitors.

Chamber Through the Decades



Raytown development didn't exactly boom through the depression and war years, however on March 3, 1946 just 4 years before the City incorporated – Charles Graham described Raytown this way in the Kansas City Star Sunday Edition: "They claim no rich people and they have no poor ones. At the time, the Chamber of Commerce makes no attempts to bring in new industries because the people are content to develop the place as a residential community on the edge of Kansas City".

Raytown claims to be no charity problem. It has a Red Cross Chapter with money in the bank – there is no charity problem here and with no public dump. Most of the businesses eat their meals at home and for those who don't there is a small town café. It is moreover, the monthly meeting place of the Chamber of

Commerce and mecca for the town's coffee drinkers around 10 o'clock every morning.

The Raytown post office is a small cube of lock boxes with one wicket, located in a modern grocery store and hardware store. The postmaster, Forest Muir, helps wait on trade in the store when the occasion demands it.

Officers of the Chamber of Commerce point with pride to three residential districts, each humorously dubbed by its own residents.

Actors Row consists of 3 houses west of town, fronting on 63rd Street and was so named because "We act as if we had money, but we don't". Mortgage Hill, a recent development of perhaps two dozen middle priced homes southwest of town, was named because the houses were built on mortgages. The Slums is an area with smaller homes where they board, every home is owned by its occupant free of debt!

Reporter Graham's description may be accurate. Conclusion of his article however since led some to wonder. "The community has numbered its east-west streets to confirm to the numbered streets of Kansas City, "he wrote, "and that, perhaps, provides the best forecast for the community's destiny." All of which was neatly upset four years later when Raytown incorporated as an independent city to avert any "destiny" as part of Kansas City. (This information was published in the Kansas City Sunday Star on March 3, 1946 by Charles W. Graham.)

Herndon Career Center Culinary Team Wins State Competition, Qualify for Nationals



Career Center Management team took first place out of five teams at the ProStart Culinary Missouri State

Expect the Exception Competition held in Springfield, Missouri.

Culinary team members include Trinity Commack, Raytown South High School; Haleigh Dyer, Lee's Summit North High School;

The Herndon Career Center Culinary team recently took first place out of 16 teams and the Herndon

Management team members include Dereck Richardson, Center High School; Alison Jones, Lee's Summit High School; and Juanisha Bradshaw, Ruskin High School.

Lauren Penner, Lee's Summit West High School; Marshawn Burnett, Ruskin High School; and Eriq Young, Ruskin High School.

The culinary team had to prepare a three course dinner with no electricity or refrigeration in front of 24 judges. The management team created a business plan based on specific criteria using critical thinking skills. The team then presented the business plan to 20 different judges.

Culinary Arts Instructor Chef Mike Chrostowski is incredibly proud of his students' hard work and dedication to the culinary program. "Both teams have spent numerous hours focusing on the smallest details and were able to watch it all pay off in the state competition," Chef Chrostowski said. "I had so many judges come to me and complement the teams not only on their dishes and their concept but on how professional and gracious they were and in my opinion, that is just as important as winning."

Students on both the culinary and management teams each received a scholarship totaling \$37,750 for earning first place in the state competition.

Both teams will now compete in the National ProStart Invitational in Washington D.C., May 8-10, 2019. This is the third year in a row that the culinary team will compete in the national competition. Last year, the Herndon Career Center Culinary team earned the title of national champions and each student received a \$200,000 scholarship.

The team is under the direction of Culinary Arts Instructor Chef Mike Chrostowski.


