It only seemed right to change a portion of the crossroads to also represent the Rock Island Rail as well as the new Rock Island Trail.



By adding "and tourism" to our name, we hope to capitalize on our position on the trail to be a center of information for any visitors.

Chamber Through the Decades



On March 26, 1925 a group of men assembled at the Raytown Bank Building (6242 Raytown Road) for the purpose of organizing the Raytown Commercial Club with George W Cassell as President. The group re-organized on October 8, 1926 as the Raytown Chamber of Commerce and began concentrating on matters of civic importance: Electricity, Telephones, Transportation, Street Lights, Fire Apparatus and of course Membership. A Sales Committee of 5 members was appointed to arrange for community sales with the Commercial Club charging a 3% fee on all sales to help fund future projects. The Chamber induced J.A. Pollitt to move his printing plant from Severance, KS and established it as the "Raytown News". Minor Smith at the age of 22 agreed to haul the printing equipment through the Kansas mud roads to Raytown. The first issue was on January 1, 1927. The Raytown Chamber of Commerce was finally approved on November 16, 1929.

City of Raytown Announces Storm Tree and Limb Debris Clean-Up Program

JANUARY 29, 2019 FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE:

The City of Raytown offers storm debris clean-up assistance to Raytown property owners.

Through the Storm Debris Clean-Up Voucher Program, Raytown property owners can come to the Public Works Department to claim two (2) FREE storm debris clean-up vouchers. The vouchers provide our residents two options: either storm debris drop off or curbside pick-up. The vouchers can be obtained at the City Hall Public Works counter between January 28, 2019 and March 29, 2019 and the last day to redeem the vouchers is April 15, 2019.

Tree and limb Storm Debris drop off option: Missouri Organic Recycling

Tree and limb Storm Debris curbside option: Compost Connection

During the two-month voucher program, Missouri Organic Recycling will be open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Debris can be dropped off at 7700 E US Hwy 40, Kansas City, MO 64129 or 10301 Raytown Rd, Kansas City, MO 64134. One storm debris voucher covers a regular-sized pick-up truck's worth of storm materials. Should a property owner need to purchase additional vouchers over and above the two (2) FREE vouchers, the \$25 vouchers are being sold for a discounted price of \$5.00.

The City of Raytown has selected Compost Connection to assist Raytown property owners with curbside pick-up. The property owner must obtain the two (2) FREE vouchers and then contact Compost Connection to schedule a Friday pick-up. The vouchers cover up to 25 bundles or yard waste bags plus the service fee. All bundles need to be 18"X 36" in size, double tied with twine or rope and set at the curb no later than 7:00 a.m. the assigned Friday morning of pick-up. The pick-ups can be scheduled through

Compost Connection for any Friday in the months of February, March and the first two Fridays in April.

Storm Debris Clean-Up vouchers can be obtained by residents, tenants, or business owners. Proof of residency or property ownership will be required at the time of obtaining vouchers.


We have an evening of festivities planned. We'll start at 6:00pm with a cash


