Statement from Matt Davis, Rock Island Project Manager

On February 20th, Jackson County entered into a trail use agreement with Union Pacific Railroad (UP), concluding the process commonly known as "railbanking." This action allows the County to move forward with construction of the second phase of the Rock Island Trail project. Construction on the trail project officially began on Monday February 24th. The County still projects to complete the trail by early 2021, although a more

New Truman Heartland Partnership Provides Job Training for In-Demand Careers

Private Giving-Public Good

The new community initiative from Truman Heartland Community Foundation (THCF), aims to help break the cycle of poverty by providing no-charge job training for in-demand careers.

The Job Skills for New Careers initiative is a collaborative partnership with Community Services League, Herndon Career Center, Mid-Continent Public Library and University of Central Missouri (UCM).

"We believe these organizations bring unique assets to the table and by working together, we can help people get connected to the trainings and resources they need to get on the path to a better job and a brighter future," said Phil Hanson, president and CEO of Truman Heartland Community Foundation.

Through this initiative, Community Services League will match applicants with financial counseling, community resources through Mid-Continent Public Library and opportunities for no-charge trainings available through Herndon Career Center and UCM in fields that pay living wages and are in high demand in the region, including healthcare, other medical fields and skilled industrial trades.

Truman Heartland is hosting two informational sessions leading up to the launch of the first cohort in March. People interested in applying for job training are encouraged to attend one of these sessions. The first session will be held on Thursday, February 6, 2020 at 7 p.m. at the Mid-Continent Public Library – South Independence Branch, 13700 East 35th St S, Independence, MO 64055. The second will be on Monday, February 10, 2020 at 7 p.m. at the Mid-Continent Public Library – North Independence Branch, 317 US-24, Independence, MO 64050. These events are free to attend and open to the public. Children's programming will be offered concurrently with both informational sessions.

Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis with the first cohort planned to launch in March. Visit newskills.cslcares.org to learn more and to apply for job training and support through the Job Skills for New Careers initiative.




