
Building Capital Campaign Update & Rock Island Trail Photos



Raytown School District Announces Alumni Hall of Fame Class of 2020 Festivities Postponed Until 2021

(Raytown, Missouri) The Raytown School District will postpone the Induction of the Alumni Hall of Fame Class for 2020 and induction festivities scheduled for Sept. 18-19, 2020 to October 15-16, 2021. The event will be rescheduled due to restrictions on gathering and to allow inductees the same including building a connection between inductees and current students and staff.

The class includes six individuals who will join the ranks of other respected alumni during the October 15-16, 2021 Induction Weekend activities.

Dr. Mark Condon is a 1964 graduate of Raytown High School. Dr. Condon has served as the Vice President at Unite for Literacy; part owner of RealeStudios and Unite for Literacy; and a teacher and teacher-educator for over 45 years.

Randy Dunn is a 2001 graduate of Raytown High School. Dunn is a former member of the Missouri House of Representatives; former Chair of the Urban Economic Development Committee; and is currently the owner and managing Partner of Dean & Dunn, LLC.

Cynthia (Cindy) Monaco is a 1975 graduate of Raytown High School. Monaco is the Owner and Director of Heart of America Dance Centre; former soloist with the Kansas City Ballet company; and has introduced and taught ballet to thousands of students over the last 30 years.

Chuck Murawski is a 1956 graduate of Raytown High School. Murawski is an Emmy award-winning scenery and lighting designer for many off and on Broadway productions and popular TV shows; a member of the Broadway Designers' Guild; and a travel and tourism industry professional.

Kelly Ristedit is a 1981 graduate of Raytown High School. Ristedit served for 32 years as a Military Spouse Liaison including the Senior Spouse Liaison to the Eisenhower Army Medical Center and was awarded and recognized for dedication to military community service. Ristedit currently volunteers with the Resurrecting Lives Foundation.

Dr. Rodney Watson is a 1990 graduate of Raytown South High School. Dr. Watson is the Superintendent of Schools for the Spring Independent School District in Houston, TX; Board Chair for the Northwest Chamber of Commerce; and is an executive pastor and faith leader at Wellspring Church International.

The six inductees will meet with students at the two district high schools, will be featured speakers at a community luncheon, and will be introduced at a football game all on Friday, October 15 at Raytown High School's Chittwood Stadium. The formal induction ceremony takes place on Saturday, October 16 and is an invitation only event.

This is the 16th class to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, which began in 2005.

RAYTOWN ROTARY & KITWE NORTH, ZAMBIA, ROTARY CLUB WORK TOGETHER

We recently received an email from the Rotary Foundation "Congratulations! Your global grant application for funding to provide 15 boreholes in four communities outside Kitwe, Zambia, submitted by the Rotary Club of Raytown and the Rotary Club of Kitwe North, has been approved

by the Rotary Foundation. The award is in the amount of \$40,001.00." Since this is the first Rotary Global Grant Raytown Rotary has ever participated in, we are really excited to learn how it will impact the communities around Kitwe, Zambia.

The project is to provide clean water and sanitation to 4 rural communities. Collectively, these settlements have a population of approximately 15,000. Provision of clean water is currently nonexistent. They rely on shallow wells which are prone to waterborne diseases.

This project will address 2 major community needs:

Provision of clean water and sanitation.

Prevention of waterborne diseases.

It will do so by trying to meet these 3 goals:

Facilitating universal and equitable access to safe and affordable drinking water.

Improving water quality by protecting and maintaining surface- and groundwater resources, reducing pollution and contaminants, and promoting wastewater reuse.

Improving community hygiene knowledge, behaviors, and practices that help prevent the spread of disease.

Budget items, including equipment and labor, will be purchased from local vendors in Zambia. After completion of the project, each community will own the equipment through their Community Development Committee. Local funding sources have been found to sustain project outcomes for the long term. Through the Area Member of Parliament there is the Constituency Development Fund from which the community can draw resources. It has also been suggested to the Committee that they charge a nominal fee for maintenance.

Project completion has been projected as July 31, 2021. We can't wait to follow the progress of this project and to learn about the community improvements realized as a result of this project.

350 Highway Construction Updates

Hwy 350 and Raytown Road Public Improvements Construction Update

On September 30, 2020, one of Bank of America's driveway entrances, as well as the IHOP driveway, will be closed to public access.

The driveway will be closed 3 weeks for the installation of the new extended turn lane.

Please pay attention when using the other Bank of America driveways because temporary changes will be made to accommodate traffic flow during construction.

CONSTRUCTION PHASES:

<u>PHASE I Improvements:</u> Upon completion of Phase I, Wal-Mart Drive will be expanded to two (2) left-turn lanes on to Westbound 350 Hwy. Curbs, sidewalks, and signage will be constructed along sections of Westbound and Eastbound 350 Hwy between Raytown Road and Wal-Mart Drive. Improvements will also be constructed at the intersection of 75th Street and Westbound 350 Hwy.

Times of Construction and Traffic Impact: Westbound 350 Hwy will have single lane closures between 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. Eastbound 350 Hwy will have channelizers and pavement edge treatment modifying traffic between 8:30am to 3:30 pm. 75th Street will maintain 2-way-2 lane traffic.

PHASE 2 Improvements: Completion of Phase 2 will result in Raytown Road having two (2) left-turn lanes on south-bound Raytown Road to Eastbound 350 Hwy. The median on Raytown Road between Westbound and Eastbound 350 Hwy will be expanded to permanently remove left-turn cut through across Raytown Road to 75th Street. The 75th Street exit off Eastbound 350 Hwy will also be eliminated in Phase 2. New curbs, as well as traffic pattern striping and signals, will be constructed on Raytown Road.

Times of Construction and Traffic Impact: Raytown Road between Westbound and Eastbound 350 Hwy will have single lane closure between **9:00 am and 4:00 pm**. Eastbound 350 Hwy will have single lane closures, as well as channelizers and pavement edge treatment when required, between **8:30am to 3:30 pm**.

PHASE 3 Improvements: The completed improvements will include the expansion of the bike and walking trail and sidewalk along the south side of Eastbound 350 Hwy. New traffic signal equipment and pedestrian signals will be installed at the intersections of Raytown Road and Westbound/Eastbound 350 Hwy. Additionally, the outer access road at the southwest corner of Eastbound 350 Hwy and Raytown Road will be converted to a pedestrian trail only. Raytown Road will be resurfaced between Westbound/Eastbound 350 Hwy and the median will be reconstructed on Raytown Road south of Eastbound 350 Hwy.

Times of Construction and Traffic Impact: Off-peak lane closures and channelizers will be utilized during this phase. Terms of the construction contract include construction delays due to winter weather, thus construction in December, January and February will be limited for lengths of times. The construction plans do not anticipate at any time closing all access drives to any Raytown businesses within the construction zone. Please come out and support the Raytown businesses during the various construction phases!



Continued Updates from the Jackson County Health Department

Help protect yourself and your loved ones by getting your annual flu shot. It is one of the best ways you can stay safe and healthy and avoid a visit to the doctor during the COVID-19 pandemic.

As the flu season approaches, health experts across the country are worried that peaks of flu and COVID-19 cases will occur at the same time. Even with a mild flu season, COVID-19, in conjunction with the flu, could place a strain on testing capacity, overburden the healthcare system, and increase the risk of catching both diseases at once.

Although there currently isn't a COVID-19 vaccine, there is a safe and effective flu vaccine. The flu vaccine reduces the risk of getting the flu <u>by about half</u>. It also reduces the risk of severe illness and hospitalization for those infected.

The <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> (CDC) recommends annual flu shots for everyone six months and older, with <u>rare exceptions</u>. You should get your flu vaccination before the flu begins spreading in the community since it takes about two weeks after vaccination for antibodies to develop in the body and provide protection against the flu. With this in mind, it is recommended that people receive the flu vaccine before the **end of October**.

Staying up-to-date on your flu shot helps protect your household members and others in the community – especially older adults, young children, pregnant women, people with chronic medical conditions or weakened immune systems, and others at high risk for severe influenza.

Flu shots are especially important this year for:

• Essential workers. This includes healthcare workers and others who offer needed services to the public during the pandemic.

People at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19. This includes older adults and people with certain underlying conditions.

- Members of minority groups that have been disproportionately affected by the coronavirus, including Black, Hispanic or Latino, American Indian, and Alaska Native people
- People at increased risk of flu complications. This includes infants and young children, <u>pregnant women</u>, people 65 and older, and people with chronic conditions.

Flu & COVID-19 Symptoms

The flu and COVID-19 share many of the same symptoms, such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, muscle aches, and fatigue. If you do start feeling sick, know the key differences between flu and COVID-19 symptoms by checking out our symptom charts in English or Spanish.
