





#### A LETTER FROM CAROL FREVERT AND MARY OYLER—RAYTOWN SUMMER LUNCH MINISTRY

Dear Friends,

I am contacting each of you as representatives of your church/organization/group because of your past commitment to volunteer with Raytown Summer Lunch Ministry.

Last year the Covid-19 pandemic changed the way our summer lunch ministry looked. As you may remember, we were not able to gather to prepare, pack and deliver lunches daily for 6 weeks in July and August. HOWEVER, we started providing a bag of groceries every Tuesday for a total of 24 weeks from March 24 through September 1. We provided a total of 3,199 families with a bag of groceries each week that provided enough food for 8 breakfast servings and 8 lunch servings with additional dairy and produce items most weeks.

None of this could have been accomplished without the financial support from all of you, our community partners, and many other churches, organizations, groups, families, and individuals, our limited number of volunteers (no more than 10 per Eastern Jackson County Covid Guidelines), our work with Hy-Vee, and our partnership with the Raytown Quality School District and other community teams also serving as food resources for our community.

Because we still are experiencing the impact of Covid-19, we have made the difficult decision to again this year continue providing a bag of groceries every Tuesday for 12 weeks, June 8 through August 24. We feel it is imperative to continue following Eastern Jackson County Covid Guidelines, which require 6 foot social distancing, wearing masks indoors and outdoors when with others, and limiting the number of volunteers who can gather safely together to pack and distribute the bags of groceries.

We know all of you would LOVE to come together to work as a team, laugh together, and serve together to provide food for the children in our community. We know it is not easy being apart, but we must continue to be cautious and focus on what keeps all of us safe and healthy and do our part to reduce the spread of Covid-19. We are hopeful that in the summer of 2022 we will be able to partner together again to continue to feed the children in the Raytown School District.

We ask that you share the information in this e-mail with your church family or organization/group members. We also would ask for your prayers for the success of our shared ministry this summer.

We continue to need financial support to provide food for children and their families. A good reference point is that it costs approximately \$20 for each bag of groceries and our plan this year is to provide 150 bags of groceries each week for the 12 weeks.

## 350 Highway Construction Updates

#### Hwy 350 and Raytown Road Public Improvements Construction Update

On September 30, 2020, one of Bank of America's driveway entrances, as well as the IHOP driveway, will be closed to public access.

The driveway will be closed 3 weeks for the installation of the new extended turn lane.

Please pay attention when using the other Bank of America driveways because temporary changes will be made to accommodate traffic flow during construction.



#### DRIVE SAFELY!

#### **CONSTRUCTION PHASES:**

<u>PHASE I Improvements:</u> Upon completion of Phase I, Wal-Mart Drive will be expanded to two (2) left-turn lanes on to Westbound 350 Hwy. Curbs, sidewalks, and signage will be constructed along sections of Westbound and Eastbound 350 Hwy between Raytown Road and Wal-Mart Drive. Improvements will also be constructed at the intersection of 75<sup>th</sup> Street and Westbound 350 Hwy.

**Times of Construction and Traffic Impact:** Westbound 350 Hwy will have single lane closures between **9:00 am to 4:00 pm**. Eastbound 350 Hwy will have channelizers and pavement edge treatment modifying traffic between **8:30am to 3:30 pm**. 75<sup>th</sup> Street will maintain 2-way-2 lane traffic.

**PHASE 2 Improvements:** Completion of Phase 2 will result in Raytown Road having two (2) left-turn lanes on southbound Raytown Road to Eastbound 350 Hwy. The median on Raytown Road between Westbound and Eastbound 350 Hwy will be expanded to permanently remove left-turn cut through across Raytown Road to 75<sup>th</sup> Street. The 75<sup>th</sup> Street exit off Eastbound 350 Hwy will also be eliminated in Phase 2. New curbs, as well as traffic pattern striping and signals, will be constructed on Raytown Road.

Times of Construction and Traffic Impact: Raytown Road between Westbound and Eastbound 350 Hwy will have single lane closure between 9:00 am and 4:00 pm. Eastbound 350 Hwy will have single lane closures, as well as channelizers and pavement edge treatment when required, between 8:30am to 3:30 pm.

**PHASE 3 Improvements:** The completed improvements will include the expansion of the bike and walking trail and sidewalk along the south side of Eastbound 350 Hwy. New traffic signal equipment and pedestrian signals will be installed at the intersections of Raytown Road and Westbound/Eastbound 350 Hwy. Additionally, the outer access road at the southwest corner of Eastbound 350 Hwy and Raytown Road will be converted to a pedestrian trail only. Raytown Road will be resurfaced between Westbound/Eastbound 350 Hwy and the median will be reconstructed on Raytown Road south of Eastbound 350 Hwy.

Times of Construction and Traffic Impact: Off-peak lane closures and channelizers will be utilized during this phase. Terms of the construction contract include construction delays due to winter weather, thus construction in December, January and February will be limited for lengths of times. The construction plans do not anticipate at any time closing all access drives to any Raytown businesses within the construction zone. ## Jackson County announces plans to ease some COVID-19 restrictions in health order

Jackson County Executive Frank White, Jr. – in consultation with Jackson County Health Department Director Bridgette Shaffer, MPH and Emergency Management Coordinator Troy Schulte – is announcing that in the coming days he plans to modify protocols to the current health order, particularly when it comes to those relating to capacity restrictions.



County Executive White stresses that while some of these restrictions are being eased, the **mask mandate** and social distancing protocols remain in effect. The new order takes effect at 12:01 a.m. Friday, April 9, 2021, the same day Phase 3 of the state's vaccination plan is activated, which opens vaccine eligibility to all Missouri adults.

"Over the past year, we have made tremendous strides to combat this pandemic and we don't want to lose the progress that we've made," said Jackson County Executive Frank White, Jr. "In order to do that, we must continue to wear face coverings and maintain our distance from others when in public spaces out of respect for those in our community who are waiting to be vaccinated. If we remain diligent in our prevention efforts, we will be one step closer to getting back some normalcy in our daily lives."

"Our health department is focused on increasing education of the vaccines that are available, providing access to them, signing up as many residents as possible and getting vaccines in arms," said Jackson County Health Department Director Bridgette Schaffer, MPH. "We look forward to receiving increased vaccine supply in the coming weeks to continue our commitment to public health and safety."

#### The protocols that will be revised beginning April 9 include:

- All essential and non-essential businesses, including gyms, fitness and recreation centers, can open at full capacity. Mask wearing and social distancing are required.
- Restaurants, bars and taverns can operate at full capacity to serve food and alcohol. Mask wearing and social distancing are required.
- There are no capacity limits on gatherings. Mask wearing and social distancing are required.
