The 50/50 Split the Pot Raffle is currently running until November 24.



RAYTOWN MAIN STREET ASSOCIATION INSALLS HISTORICAL PLAQUES

RAYTOWN PARKS & RECREATION

RAYTOWN PARKS STAFF REPAIRS IN-HOUSE REPAIRS TO MINOR-SMITH TENNIS COURTS

The Raytown Parks staff took on a project to try to repair in-house the Minor-Smith tennis courts. These courts were cracked from being weathered through freeze and thaw cycles, and due to their age.

Tony Mesa, the Raytown Parks Superintendent of Maintenance searched a new patching material, a naturally occurring asphalt, and the crew went to work. They first cleared the cracks and even cut away some asphalt to make patching easier. They then compacted the material into the cracks in the court, and ground down the material until it was level with the rest of the court surface. Parks

staff then sealed with a overlay, and painted the surface to make it more weather resistant.

The final stage was repainting the set of tennis courts to make everything match. The guys taped over the boundary lines to protect them, and painted the inside of the courts. The paint was left to dry for a day, and staff returned to paint the out of bounds areas of the tennis courts. After a drying period we removed the tape and were very pleased to see the results!

This type of work through a contractor would have been bid at over \$60,000. With the materials being purchased and work completed in-house, the Parks Department spent around \$4,000 and staff time to preserve these courts and get them in great shape for our park patrons! This was a tremendous improvement and shows how versatile our maintenance staff are in taking on repairs of all kinds.

Missouri Department of Natural Resources Award Matching Grant to Raytown Parks & Rec

Funds will improve Kenagy Park

In October, the Missouri Department of Natural Resources selected Raytown Parks & Recreation Department as one of 20 recipients of the 2020 Land Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) grant program. Raytown Parks will use the funds to renovate the tennis courts at Kenagy Park, 9608 E 79th Street. The tennis courts were last renovated in 1996.

"We applied for this grant in February 2020 – COVID slowed the process," said Raytown Parks & Recreation Director Dave Turner." But after many delays, we are excited to learn that our project fit the criteria and was approved for assistance."

The project is estimated at \$400,000, with half of this cost to be matched by the LWCF grant. The renovations include overlay of four tennis courts with post tension concrete. This compressed concrete construction technique increases the lifespan versus the traditional asphalt surface, causing the tennis courts to last for at least 40 years or more. The RFP process for this project will open soon. The project must be completed by Sept. 30, 2023.

The LWCF is administered through the Department of Interior via the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, State Parks Division and has funded community projects since 1965. This project by the Raytown Parks Department will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered pursuant to this grant, businesses owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to the upcoming bid invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, religion, creed, sex, age, ancestry or national origin in consideration for award. Federal Land and Water Conservation Funds are being used in this project, and all relevant federal, state, and local requirements will apply.

S&P Improves Credit Rating for Raytown Sewerage System

City's bonds move up to stable, affirms 'A+' credit rating

S&P Global Ratings has revised its credit rating on the City of Raytown's Sewerage System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2013, from negative to stable, while simultaneously affirming

the 'A+' credit rating on the debt.

According to S&P's report, the improved outlook reflects "the City's team making rate adjustments to improve coverage and liquidity levels, informing our view of stabilizing utility operations after multiple years of reserve draws." S&P also notes that the system's financial operations have shown improvement over the past three years, a trend that it expects will continue with strong debt service coverage ratios that are "likely to see further improvement beginning in 2022."

The credit agency provided the system with a good financial management assessment, noting "thorough revenue and expense assumptions, budget monitoring, informal long-range financial planning as reflected in the system's rate study, and suitable capital planning including costs." The report also notes the system's "robust liquidity position" and "manageable capital improvement plan," which focuses heavily on replacing critical system components and the maintenance of current system assets.

S&P indicated that it expects to see the City "resume raising rates in line with its rate study completed in 2018." The City enacted a moratorium on additional rate increases in 2020 and 2021 in response to the pandemic.

"We are very pleased with the revised rating outlook," said Finance Director Russ Petry. "The City has worked diligently in recent years to maintain healthy utility operations and to formulate a sound capital improvement plan, all while keeping utility rates affordable and addressing pandemic-related challenges. It's encouraging to see these efforts acknowledged by S&P and reflected in an improved rating outlook."

The City is currently working with its financial advisor, Columbia Capital Management, on evaluating the potential refinancing of the Series 2013 Bonds to produce interest savings for the City.
