By adding the new entrance, we will be able to accommodate those individuals who have not been able to get into the building previously because of being in a wheelchair.





Dr. Allan Markley Announces Retirement



Raytown C-2 School District Superintendent of Schools Dr. Allan Markley announced his retirement, effective June 30, 2022. Upon his retirement, he will have served 27 years in education, 21 years as a superintendent and 14 years in the Raytown C-2 School District.

Raytown Schools Board President Alonzo Burton shared comments on behalf of the Board of Education, "We are grateful for the leadership and insight Dr. Markley has provided during his tenure in Raytown. As we look to the future, we will continue the momentum of our past successes. We now have the very important task of finding Dr. Markley's successor. We ensure our stakeholders that we will work diligently to identify the best possible candidate for this job."

In a letter to staff, Dr. Markley shared, "It is incredibly hard to think that my time in the Raytown C-2 School District is nearing its end. I take so much pride in the memories and successes that have filled the last 13 years of my career."

Under Dr. Markley's leadership, the District has attained several notable accomplishments. Highlights include:

- Increased student ACT scores, attendance and graduation rate
- Expanded early childhood offerings and opened Three Trails Preschool
- Launched the Southland Center for Advanced Professional Studies (Southland CAPS)

- O Opened Herndon Career Center Culinary Arts Institute and Cinder Restaurant
- O Opened the Raytown Schools Wellness Center and the award-winning employee onsite Quality Care Clinic
- O Recognized as one of the Healthiest Employers in Kansas City by the Kansas City Business Journal four years in a row
- O Received Platinum certification from the Greater Kansas City Chamber of Commerce's Healthy KC Workplace Wellness Certification Program (Healthy KC) in 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020

Now 13 years later, we have a senior and junior at Raytown High School and a fifth grader at Norfleet. Seth, Luke and Josh are learning to become outstanding citizens because of the staff, students, families and community members who make this a wonderful place to raise children."

Dr. Markley began his employment with the Raytown C-2 School District in the fall of 2008, serving as Superintendent of Schools.







September is National Preparedness Month



Local SERVPRO disaster mitigation specialist urges Raytown-area residents to create a disaster management and recovery plan before the unexpected happens

September is National Preparedness Month, part of the ongoing "Ready" initiative of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). According to FEMA's "Are You Ready" guide, the first step in effective disaster preparedness is to understand your specific risks - first by identifying the hazards that could possibly affect you and then by evaluating your actual vulnerability to those sources of danger.

"Once you understand your risks, you can effectively plan to mitigate them by decreasing your vulnerability and then manage their consequences quickly and effectively if the worst does happen," says disaster mitigation specialist Chad Kimbley of SERVPRO® of Raytown/ East Kansas City. "Of course, individual home or business owners' risks vary depending on their location, but regardless of where you live or work, FEMA's guide has some basic steps that everyone can take to prepare for the unexpected."

- 1. Create a family communication and shelter plan.
- 2. Sign up for emergency alerts, including FEMA alerts³.
- 3. Build your savings if possible and keep a small emergency fund of cash on-hand at home.
- 4. Create an Emergency Financial First Aid Kit⁴: Gather and safeguard critical documents like deeds, medical information, insurance policies, and a list of your household belongings.

Create an emergency kit⁵ with basic tools and enough food and water to last 72 hours and keep the contents fresh and up to date. In addition to the planning tools and checklists provided by FEMA, businesses like SERVPRO that specialize in disaster mitigation and restoration offer free tools that make disaster recovery easier. The free SERVPRO READY app⁶ allows home and business owners to store essential contact and property information electronically where it can be accessed in seconds with a mobile device. Local business owners who designate SERVPRO of Raytown/East Kansas City as their disaster mitigation and restoration provider benefit from a no-cost assessment of their facility along with help completing a comprehensive Emergency READY Profile® (ERP) to be stored in the READY app.

"The uncomfortable truth is that no amount of preparedness will prevent disasters from striking, but preparedness can help disaster victims survive and then recover," says Kimbley. "When disaster strikes, sometimes it's difficult to even know where to start picking up the pieces. Having critical documents and details at your fingertips helps, but so does having access to professionals who know how to help you return to normal, 'Like it never even happened.'
