PRESIDENT'S CORNER

RAYTOWN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE BUILDING FOUNDATION UPDATE

One year ago, the Raytown Chamber of Commerce Building Foundation launched a Capital Campaign to raise \$211,000 to help offset costs associated with inside and outside building improvements. Here is an update on what has been raised and completed at this time:

From March 1, 2020 through February 15, 2021, total amount raised was \$49,167.00.

Items completed include:

New electrical panel

Inside lighting upgraded to LED

Ceilings painted

Survey of the property

Remodel of the entire parking lot which allowed for the front area to be closed off.

Establishment of the Plaza area

(As of February 11, 2021 the Board of Directors have voted to change this to the "Raytown Chamber Trailhead". This name will be listed on future maps and will give more exposure not only to the Chamber but to the trailhead.)

We have applied for various grants. Below is a list of Grants secured to date and what the funds were used for:

AARP Community Challenge Grant – Purchased an upgraded water fountain to allow for water bottles to be filled; 2 six-foot benches; slat wall display system for tourism brochures; water-proof display board that will be put outside on the front walls once the construction on the front of the building is complete; and a bike repair stand.

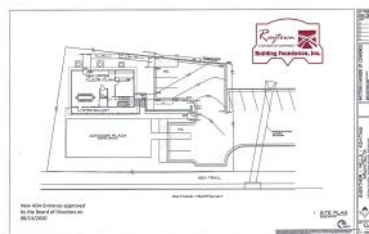
Truman Heartland Community Grants – Purchased 1 four-foot bench; trash can; 2-tenant outdoor mailbox; 2 bike racks (remaining grant funds will be applied for cement, installation and labor).

Christopher & Dana Reeve Foundation - This is a new grant that will be received this month. A large outside project remaining is the Building Accessibility Project, which will bring the building up to ADA compliance, inside and outside. This portion of the project has a price tag of approximately \$60,000. This grant will cover the tangible items associated with this project. The Building Foundation needs to raise the remaining \$48,000 or receive in-kind donations to cover the grading and the cement for the new handicapped entrance.

As we look to the next few months, we think about the \$150,000 needed to finish the remodeling project. As we continue to raise funds, apply for grants, and look for donations of products and services, The Rock Island Trail will soon open, and we are working to have the outside project done this summer.

Other items to finish the outside include; paint, stone to be applied to the front columns, removal of a door, siding replacement and windows, along with landscaping which will include a purple haze butterfly garden along with native prairie grass and the planting of a tree in the grassy area between the parking lot and the trail. The goal is to finish the outside first and then move inside.

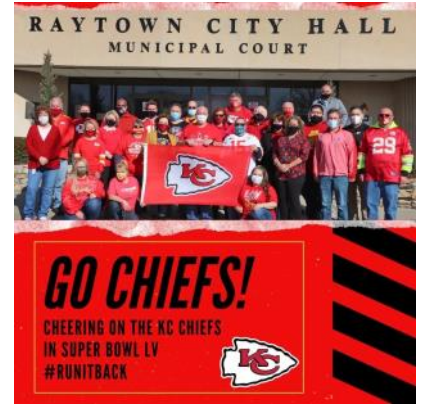

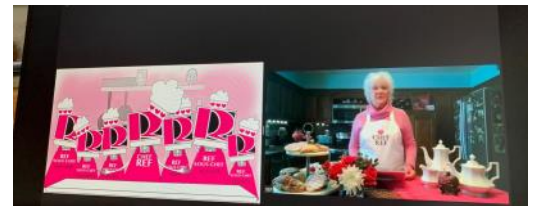

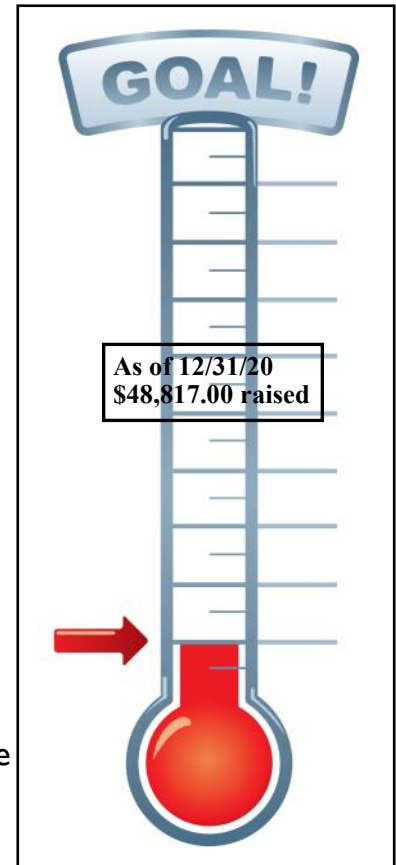


Building Capital Campaign Update & Rock Island Trail Photos

The Building Foundation is excited to announce that we have been awarded a grant through the **Christopher & Dana Reeve Foundation** to help with costs associated with the Building Accessibility Project. This portion of the remodel will allow for total accessibility into the second floor of the building. We still need to secure about \$48,000 more to complete this project (layout of the ramp, grading and cement). To help offset this costs, if anyone is willing to donate the grading work or the cement, please contact Vicki today.

The Board of Directors voted on February 11 to call the front area at the Chamber location the "Raytown Chamber Trailhead". The Raytown Chamber Trailhead will have 3 six-foot benches, a trash can, two bike racks and one bike repair stand. These amenities were purchased with grants from AARP and Truman Heartland Community Foundation. The Raytown Rotary Club received a grant to purchase a bench and it will be installed as well. Remember all monetary donations will receive a charitable tax deduction letter from the Building Foundation. Several companies have reached out and offered discounts and even full donation of items which we greatly appreciate.

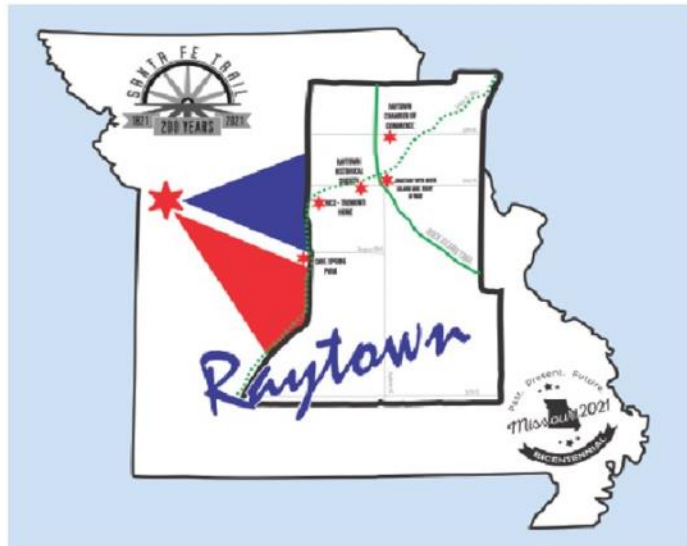

RAYTOWN PARKS AND RECREATION RECEIVES GENEROUS DONATION

The Raytown Chamber of Commerce donated their Welcome to Raytown sign that stood in front of the Chamber on 59th & Raytown Rd for almost 20 years. The Raytown Parks maintains 10 of these signs at key entry points to the city. The Chamber of Commerce has been updating their location with private and state grant funds and had taken their sign down during the renovation project. In

December the Welcome to Raytown sign at 53rd & Raytown Rd was destroyed in a traffic accident. The signs that originally cost \$350 each in 2002, now would cost \$1,500 to replace from the manufacturer. The Chamber sign that was not in use was then donated to the Parks Dept. to help offset the cost of replacement, and to speed up the process of receiving the sign. Parks maintenance staff then had to make some modifications to the sign and repaint it to match the other 9 existing signs, and to bring the sign back up to its new original form. We thank the Chamber for their generous donation, and to our talented maintenance staff who modified the and painted the sign in a way that makes it indistinguishable to the other 9 signs that are on display. The Parks Dept. will update the 53rd ST sign location with new plantings since the flower bed was severely damaged in the incident, and of course re-install the donated sign. The work will require pouring concrete and taking careful measurements to get it mounted correctly. This is one more example of the Parks Dept taking on an inhouse project with some support from the community, which will save the taxpayers of Raytown some budgetary funds upon completion.

350 Highway Construction Updates

Hwy 350 and Raytown Road Public Improvements Construction Update

On September 30, 2020, one of Bank of America's driveway entrances, as well as the IHOP driveway, will be closed to public access.

The driveway will be closed 3 weeks for the installation of the new extended turn lane.

Please pay attention when using the other Bank of America driveways because temporary changes will be made to accommodate traffic flow during construction.

CONSTRUCTION PHASES:

PHASE 1 Improvements: Upon completion of Phase 1, Wal-Mart Drive will be expanded to two (2) left-turn lanes on to Westbound 350 Hwy. Curbs, sidewalks, and signage will be constructed along sections of Westbound and Eastbound 350 Hwy between Raytown Road and Wal-Mart Drive. Improvements will also be constructed at the intersection of 75th Street and Westbound 350 Hwy.

Times of Construction and Traffic Impact: Westbound 350 Hwy will have single lane closures between **9:00 am to 4:00 pm**. Eastbound 350 Hwy will have channelizers and pavement edge treatment modifying traffic between **8:30am to 3:30 pm**. 75th Street will maintain 2-way-2 lane traffic.

PHASE 2 Improvements: Completion of Phase 2 will result in Raytown Road having two (2) left-turn lanes on southbound Raytown Road to Eastbound 350 Hwy. The median on Raytown Road between Westbound and Eastbound 350 Hwy will be expanded to permanently remove left-turn cut through across Raytown Road to 75th Street. The 75th Street exit off Eastbound 350 Hwy will also be eliminated in Phase 2. New curbs, as well as traffic pattern striping and signals, will be constructed on Raytown Road.

Times of Construction and Traffic Impact: Raytown Road between Westbound and Eastbound 350 Hwy will have single lane closure between **9:00 am and 4:00 pm**. Eastbound 350 Hwy will have single lane closures, as well as channelizers and pavement edge treatment when required, between **8:30am to 3:30 pm**.

PHASE 3 Improvements: The completed improvements will include the expansion of the bike and walking trail and sidewalk along the south side of Eastbound 350 Hwy. New traffic signal equipment and pedestrian signals will be installed at the intersections of Raytown Road and Westbound/Eastbound 350 Hwy. Additionally, the outer access road at the southwest corner of Eastbound 350 Hwy and Raytown Road will be converted to a pedestrian trail only. Raytown Road will be resurfaced between Westbound/Eastbound 350 Hwy and the median will be reconstructed on Raytown Road south of Eastbound 350 Hwy.

Times of Construction and Traffic Impact: Off-peak lane closures and channelizers will be utilized during this phase. Terms of the construction contract include construction delays due to winter weather, thus construction in December, January and February will be limited for lengths of times. The construction plans do not anticipate at any time closing all access drives to any Raytown businesses within the construction zone. Please come out and support the Raytown businesses during the various construction phases!

SAFER AT HOME RECOVERY PLAN



Order goes into effect at 12:01 a.m. Friday, February 26, 2021



Masks Required

All persons over the age of five, including employees or visitors, present at any business, public accommodation, or outdoors where social distancing is not possible must wear a face mask or covering.*



Bars & Restaurants Resume Normal Hours

Restaurants, taverns, and all other venues serving food and drink indoors may now resume normal hours.



50 Person Gathering Limit

All gatherings shall not exceed fifty (50) people.**



Must Wear Masks at Gym

At gyms, fitness, and recreational centers all patrons must wear masks indoors at all times and maintain social distancing of no less than six feet.

Parties are limited to 10 or fewer persons and parties shall be spaced with no less than six feet of distance between themselves and individuals from any other parties.



50% Business Occupancy

All businesses that are frequented by the public must limit the number of individuals (staff and customers) in the building or room to 50% of the lowest occupancy load of the room or facility in which the gathering is occurring. This is only permissible as long as adequate social distancing can be maintained.



Post Social Distancing Protocol

All businesses that are open to the general public are required to complete and post a Social Distancing Protocol that is easily accessible to the staff and customers.

*The following individuals are exempt from the requirement to wear a face covering: those who are deaf or hard of hearing, children younger than five years old; and children who are younger than two years old should never wear face coverings due to the risk of suffocation. Children who are two, three, or four years old, with the assistance and close supervision of an adult, are strongly recommended to wear a face covering at all times in settings, like grocery stores or pharmacies, where it is likely that a distance of at least six feet cannot be maintained from non-household members and vulnerable people must go. Persons with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a face covering. This includes, but is not limited to, persons with a medical condition for whom wearing a face covering could obstruct breathing or who are unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a face covering without assistance. Businesses shall deny entry to and refuse to serve members of the public who refuse to wear face coverings, unless a medical exemption applies or the individual is a child under the age of five. A business shall neither require the individual to produce medical documentation verifying a medical condition or disability, nor ask about the nature of a medical condition or disability. Businesses are encouraged to offer members of the public alternatives to in-person shopping such as curbside pickup and delivery.

**Face covering exemptions do not apply to gyms, fitness, and recreational centers. Face coverings must be worn at all times while inside these facilities, including while working out. If you are unable to wear a mask because of difficulty breathing during high intensity activities, choose an outdoor location with greater ventilation and air exchange and where social distancing from others can be guaranteed. Participants may consult with their primary care provider to determine if vigorous activity while wearing a mask is safe for them.

§All gatherings exceeding 50 people are required to submit a Gathering Protocol at least 7 business days in advance of the event (except for churches, which are at 50% capacity). The Gathering Protocol must be approved by Jackson County and easily accessible to all attendees.
