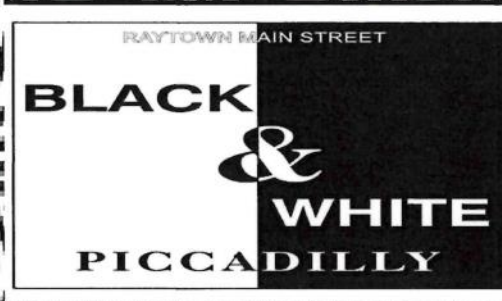

Graham, who started Jan. 23, is the latest in the string of appointments to fill the leadership vacancies.

“Since COVID, the City of Raytown has been affected by the labor shortage that has plagued municipalities and other businesses,” said City Administrator Damon Hodges. “We are pleased to welcome Michael, Rob, and Diane who all bring a wealth of experience and passion to the team. I am confident that their contributions will enhance our level of service to our residents while continuing to maintain prudent fiscal responsibility.”

Graham brings more than 30 years of experience in finance, grants, financial analysis, and payroll. His most recent position was Senior Vice President Administration/CFO with the Kansas City Area Transportation Authority. As Finance Director, Graham will oversee and manage sewer billing and collections, city revenue collections, the budget and all other activities, programs, and operations of the Finance Department.

Camp, who started Dec. 5, comes to the City from the Blanchard, Oklahoma area, where he previously worked for a national infrastructure company as well as the Cities of Chickasha and Enid as Public Works Director. He has more than 10 years of experience managing multi-million-dollar infrastructure projects.

Egger, comes to the City from the City of Independence, bringing two decades of experience in public health and community development. Egger started on July 18, 2022, and oversees code enforcement, animal control, business licensing, the rental inspection program and all operations of the Community Development Department.

The Rotary Club of Raytown and the Raytown Parks Dept. applied for a grant through Rotary International for new play equipment at Kenagy Park. This equipment is going to add a musical element to the main playground at that location. The Tongue Drums from Landscape Structures cost \$5,725, with \$2,500 coming from Rotary International, \$2,500 from Rotary Club of Raytown, and the remaining \$725 paid by the Raytown Parks. These drums were installed last week on January 27<sup>th</sup> by the Rotary volunteers and Raytown Parks staff.

The drums were cut out of the new playground installation in 2022 when the project came in over budget for the Parks Dept. We are glad that the Rotary Club of Raytown found a way to bring this new equipment to the kids in Raytown and we expect them to see a lot of use over the coming years!

### Raytown Quality Schools 2023 Bond Proposal Would Address Immediate Structural Needs and Enhance District High School Arts and Athletics Spaces

The Raytown Quality Schools Board of Education voted unanimously to place a no tax increase \$35 million bond and a no tax increase levy transfer on the ballot for the upcoming April 4, 2023 election. If approved, the bond would address immediate structural repair needs and allow for updated arts and activities spaces at both district high schools, Raytown South High School and Raytown High School.

At RSHS, approval of the no tax increase bond would allow the district to move forward with a two-part plan to build a modern performing arts center and an auxiliary gym. The proposed modern performing arts center will be a new facility on the high school campus that will include a technology and competition space with the capability to project a large screen, provide flexible seating with tiered platforms, and serve as a modifiable space for multiple class and activity use throughout the school day.

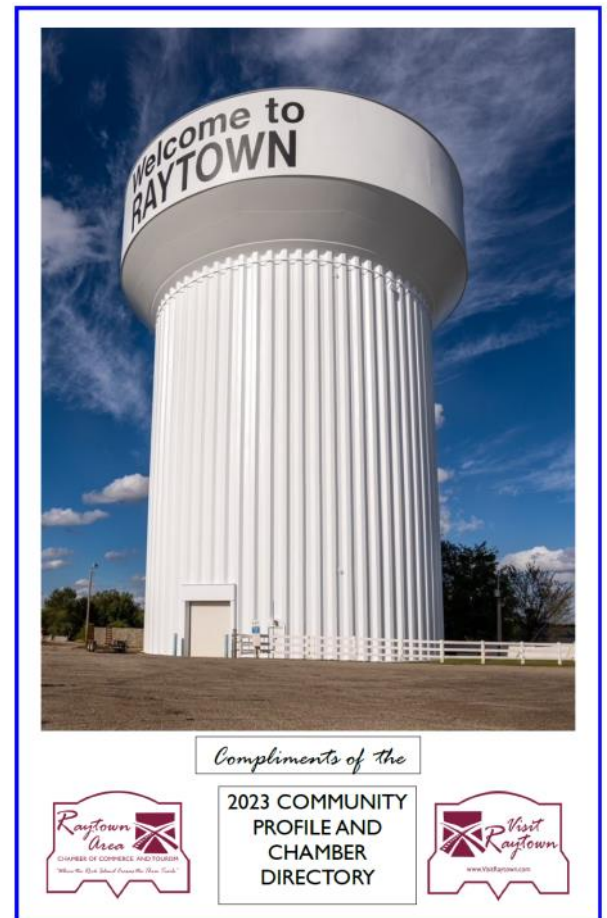
Bonds funds would also support a new and updated auxiliary gym at both high schools, on par with the school districts in the metropolitan area. The existing performing arts center at RSHS will be razed and turned into an auxiliary gym, which the school does not currently have. Bond funds would be used to build a much-needed auxiliary gym at RHS. An auxiliary gym is essential to accommodate sports and activities at each high school and provide the district the opportunity to host sports tournaments.

While bond funds must be dedicated to construction and renovation of buildings, levies are for all other costs of running district schools. The proposed no tax increase levy transfer would authorize the transfer of 18 cents in excess levy from the district's debt service fund into the schools operating fund. This would allow the district to address important needs while continuing to pay debts on time with zero increase to the total tax rate.

Voters will have the opportunity to vote on the proposed bond measure on the Tuesday, April 4, 2023 election.
