

It was a little past midnight when Tim and Susie turned onto Rickey Road, taking the long way home to Susie's house. It was a moonless night, with a light fog beginning to settle down over the twisting, winding road.

As the car moved past the old stone wall along the side of the road, Tim's car began to make an odd noise. While the car was older, Tim kept it in great condition and had just filled the gas tank prior to picking up Susie for their date. Tim pulled over as far as possible on the narrow, dark road and shut off the engine. After some debate, Tim left Susie in the car, planning to hike over to one of the few houses on the far side of the old wooden bridge.

Susie sat in the car, listening to the rustle of the leaves, watching the light fog thicken around the car. Leaning her head back, humming to herself, Susie found herself nodding off as she waited for Tim to return.



Susie jerked awake as she suddenly heard a strange noise. Straining to discern where the noise had originated, she peered into the dark night, the car now fully shrouded in fog. How long had she been asleep? Of all the nights to have forgotten her watch! Then the noise came again, a definite scratching sound. Susie froze in the passenger seat, her mouth dry, throat constricted with fear. Surely it was taking much too long for Tim to return, wasn't it? She heard the noise again and decided it was probably a tree limb hanging over the car, blowing in the light breeze. Even with the rationalization, Susie was kept awake by the scratching noise and her concern for Tim.



As night turned into early dawn, Susie knew she had to leave the car and find Tim. She had stayed in the car because she knew the rumors people spread about the Asylum off Raytown Road and how some of the patients often escaped. Shaking her head at the outrageousness of the rumor, she opened the car door and climbed out of the car. As she stretched her cramped muscles from sitting in the car all night, she heard the scratching again. Turning, she saw Tim, hanging upside down from the tree over the car, his fingernails scratching the top of the car as his dead body swung in the breeze. Screaming, Susie ran from the car......

Welcome to one of the many iterations of the haunting of Rickey Road. A popular Urban Legend in the 1960s, '70s, and '80s, the mystery surrounding Rickey Road began with legends similar to the story above, along with tales of people seeing non-existent cemeteries, a witch's house that only appeared on certain nights, a rolling head (most likely Susie's!), and the sounds of footsteps on the old wooden bridge.

Like most urban legends, the haunting of Rickey Road was spread among several generations of Raytown residents, from parents to children, and from friend to friend. The old wooden bridge was a focal point; it's age alone fodder for tales that inspire fear in a person's heart. As time passed, the story of Tim and Susie (names invented for this tale) took on other aspects, all ending with Tim's death.

Rickey Road would eventually be used for Driver's Education as well as training ground for the high school athletes who were runners. In the 1990s and 2000s, the old wooden bridge was replaced with a concrete bridge and the area was developed with single family homes. As is often the case with urban legends, the modernization and development brought the end of the tales of Rickey Road. Saying that, if you bring up Rickey




Rice -Tremonti Paranormal Investigation tours
